 - Great way to keep your finger on the pulse of what's going on in Metro ATL. Topics: national, regional, and community issues
- Golf Tournament (September)
 - One of the largest business tournament in Cobb
 - A day on the course with the opportunity to network with Chamber leadership, board members, and elected officials
 - Great sponsorship opportunities
- Cobb Connections (typically twice each month)
 - Networking event: give a 30 second elevator speech
 - Currently in-person and virtual

 - Top 25 Businesses are featured in addition to Business of the Year

 - Opportunity for community leaders to travel to DC, meet with legislative leaders, and discuss the pro-business advocacy agenda



Leadership/Growth Opportunities (deepen your involvement!):

 - Women Executives that manage a budget and/or team
 - Monthly luncheon meetings with keynote speakers focusing on topics pertaining to women leading in the workplace
 - Must be a Chamber member \$125 yearly dues + one time \$25 new member fee

 - Pairing of CYP with an established leader in the Chamber community further leadership development and make connections

 - Develop leadership skills
 - Application process Feb/Mar, Selections in June- summer before senior year 55 selected
 - Program runs August April

 - Pairs community and business leaders with military commanders
 - Yearlong program
 - Nomination and application process Class of 50 (25 military and 25 business/comm. Leaders)
 - Very active alumni group serves as a steering committee for the incoming class
- Leadership Cobb & Alumni Association
 - Prestigious leadership program provides a unique learning experience about the ins and outs of Cobb
 - Topics include: Armed Forces, Arts & Recreation, Econ. Development, Education, Health, Leadership Training, Mentoring, Politics, Public Safety, Regionalism, Social Services
 - Nominations in January, Application process in March, Selection in May Class of 50
 - Very active alumni serves as a steering committee for the incoming class

 - Small group meetings and discussions- Think of this as a business book club
 - Share best practices, and explores business/professional growth through bestselling business book reviews
 - For chamber members only free to attend

 - Open, unbiased opportunity to share challenges and successes with on-level peers
 - Application and selection process 12-20 members per group
 - \$250 member fee / \$650 non-member fee

 - Collaborations between education partners (high school, college, and technical), workforce training partners (WorkSource Cobb and DOL), and the private sector
 - Goal is to ensure a talent pipeline for Cobb County businesses
