



MAJOR GENERAL KONATA A. CRUMBLY

Commanding General Georgia Air National Guard

Major General Konata “Deuce” Crumbly assumed the duties of the Commanding General for the Georgia Air National Guard on 28 February 2023. He is responsible for more than 2,900 Georgia Air National Guard Airmen and civilians serving within six locations across the state. In addition, General Crumbly serves as the Air National Guard Assistant to the Commander of the United States Transportation Command.

Major General Crumbly graduated from the Reserve Officer Training Corps at Florida A & M University, Tallahassee, in April 1996. He attended Army Aviation Flight School at Fort Rucker, Alabama and earned his wings as a UH-60 A/L Blackhawk pilot. After completing his Army Aviation service commitment which included Operation Allied Force and the initial invasion of Iraq with the 3rd Infantry Division, General Crumbly joined the Georgia Air National Guard as an E-8C Joint Surveillance Target Attack Radar System (JSTARS) pilot in 2004. He has flown combat missions in support of Operations Iraqi Freedom and Enduring Freedom as well as missions in support of United States Africa Command.

General Crumbly’s command experience includes the 12th Expeditionary Airborne Command and Control Squadron, the 116th Operations Group, and the 116th Air Control Wing, Robins Air Force Base, Georgia. Most recently, he served as Director of the Joint Staff for the Georgia National Guard.

Major General Crumbly’s military decorations include the Legion of Merit, the Meritorious Service Medal, the Air Medal, the Air Force Commendation Medal, the Army Commendation Medal, and the Army Achievement Medal.
